It is the most teen**Y** tin**Y** letter. You use it a lot like the letter **Y**. It sounds like **Y**. It represents the number 10.

YOD is often used as part of a vowel. Sometimes it is used like this:  $(\underline{H}_{iriq} Maleh = "ee")$ .

It can also be used for other vowel sounds, such as: (sounds like a long "I" as in "aye");

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(sounds like "ey" as in "they").
