- The plural form of each word is listed after its singular form. If no plural form is listed, it means that no such form exists or that it is very rarely used.
- The plural form can be translated as sons or children.

## **Pronouns**

The Hebrew words אָרָ, אָרָה, אָרָה, אָרָה, and אָרָה, are all singular pronouns. They each have a corresponding plural form. Below is a chart showing all the singular and plural subject pronouns.

## Two Forms of We

The two Hebrew words ? and ? I A both mean we. They can be used interchangeably. Just like ? A, they are used for both males and females.

We are the daughters.אֲנַחְנוֹ הַבְּנוֹת.We are Abraham and Moses.אֲנַחְנוֹ אֲבְרָהָם וֹמֹשֶׁה.We are Sarah and Leah.אֲנוֹ שְׂרָה וְלֵאָה.

We are the kings.

אָנוּ הַמְּלָכִים.

The plural form  $\square \nearrow \aleph$  is used when addressing two or more males.

You are the fathers.

אַתָּם הָאָבוֹת.

Like the plural form  $\square$ , the plural form  $\square$  is used when the group referred to contains both males and females.

You are Sarah and Moses. אַתָּם שְׂרָה וּמֹשֶׁה.

You are the fathers and the daughters.

Masculine plural forms are always used in Hebrew when referring to groups containing both males and females.

#### The Extra Pronoun

In short noun sentences, the words 377, 377, and often appear with the two nouns or groups of nouns. These extra pronouns need not be translated.

The father is the king.

הָאָב הוּא הַמֶּלֶרְ.

Sarah is the mother.

שָּׁרָה הִיא הָאֵם.

The kings are the fathers. הַּמְּלָכִים הָם הָאָבוֹת.

These extra pronouns may appear in noun sentences with any noun. X:17 and Diff are used with masculine nouns. X:77 and Tild are used with feminine nouns.

Israel is a nation.

יִשְׂרָאֵל הוּא עַם.

The Torah is truth.

הַתּוֹרָה הִיא אֱמֶת.

These are the words.

אֵלֶּה הֵם הַדְּבָרִים.

Sometimes the word X17 is used after the pronoun 77% in short noun sentences. This X17 also does not need to be translated.

You are the king.

אַמָה הוא הַמֶּלֶדְּ.

You are the father.

אַתָּה הוא הָאַב.

In Hebrew, feminine plural forms like \\ \text{In} \text{\text{and}} \text{and} \\ \text{ln} \text{are} \\
very rare and do not appear at all in the prayerbook. In this book, we will introduce these forms along with more common forms so that you can see the complete structure of the language.
